TOPIC EDITOR ROLE DESCRIPTION

- 1. Provide expertise in a specific area of occupational therapy;
- 2. Provide assistance for the development of relevant content for an Occupational Therapy Now topic;
- Provide expert opinion to the editor of Occupational Therapy Now regarding practice concerns of occupational therapists.
- 4. Evaluate proposals and/or articles for suitability for publication;
- 5. Provide constructive feedback to authors;
- Assist with editing articles;
- 7. Mentor authors to write for the topic;
- Assist with soliciting articles;
- 9. Respect confidentiality of material submitted for publication;
- 10. Liaise with the Occupational Therapy Now Managing Editor;
- 11. Identify and manage conflicts of interest.
- 12. Review the description of the topic on an annual basis to ensure that the topic continues to be relevant for CAOT members and reflective of the topics of articles.
- 13. Topic Editors will meet three times a year. Attendance at the meetings is based on availability.
- 14. Topic Editors are required to be members of CAOT.
